Saints of the Day: St. Xenia of Petersburg

The following Troparia and Kontakia are sung after the Little Entrance:

(**Resurrectional Troparion--Tone 1**) When the stone had been sealed by the Jews; while the soldiers were guarding Thy most pure Body; Thou didst rise on the third day, O Savior, granting life to the world. The powers of heaven therefore cried to Thee O Giver of Life: Glory to Thy resurrection O Christ! Glory to Thy kingdom! Glory to Thy dispensation, O Thou Who lovest mankind.

(All Saints Troparion) As with fine porphyry and royal purple, Thy Church has been adorned with Thy martyrs' blood shed throughout all the world. She cries to Thee, O Christ God: Send down Thy bounties on Thy people, grant peace to Thy habitation, and great mercy to our souls.

(**Blessed Xenia of St. Petersburg Troparion--Tone 5**) Having lived as a stranger in the world, you outwitted the deviser of evil by your pretended foolishness, O Xenia. You received the grace from God to foresee and foretell things to come. Now are you have been translated from earth to heaven, you are numbered with the choirs of the Angels.

(**Resurrectional Kontakion--Tone 1**) As God, Thou didst rise from the tomb in glory, raising the world with Thyself. Human nature praises Thee as God, for death has vanished. Adam exult O Master! Eve rejoices, for she is freed from bondage, and cries to Thee: Thou art the Giver of resurrection to all, O Christ.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: (Blessed Xenia Kontakion--Tone 4) You gave your wealth to the poor, O Xenia, and accepted poverty out of love for Christ; having lived a life rivaling the Angels, you were accounted worthy of glory on high.

Now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen (Steadfast Protectress Kontakion--Tone 6) Steadfast Protectress of Christians, Constant Advocate before the Creator; despise not the entreating cries of us sinners, but in your goodness come speedily to help us who call on you in faith. Hasten to hear our petition and to intercede for us, O Theotokos, for you always protect those who honor you.

The Orthodox Teaching on Cremation from the OCA Clergy Guidelines:

1. The practice of cremation is not a Christian one and is to be discouraged. Cremated remains are not to be brought into the temple for a burial service or for any other reason. 2. Although cremation is not encouraged, and the Funeral Service over cremated remains is denied, the remains may be buried only with the hymn Holy God... (Taken from OCA Clergy Guidelines).
