## On the Nativity of Jesus Christ-These Truths We Hold.

In the earliest days of Christianity, the Feast of the Nativity of Christ was not generally celebrated in the Church. First mention of the Feast is made by St. Clement of Alexandria, who mentions that certain Egyptians commemorated the birth of Christ on May 20. The *Apostolic Constitutions* of the first half of the 4<sup>th</sup> century set forth that January 6 should be celebrated as both the feast of the Nativity and Epiphany. St. Gregory of Nyssa in 380 wrote that the faithful of Cappadocia celebrated the Nativity on December 25. The Feast was not celebrated in Jerusalem until the 6<sup>th</sup> Century, while St. John Chrysostom introduced it at Antioch in 386 and at Constantinople between 398-402. In Rome the feast of the Nativity of Christ had been celebrated on December 25 since 354.

December 25 was ultimately chosen by the Church as the date of the Nativity in order to *Christianize* the pagan Feast of Natalis Invicti or *Invincible Sun*, which was celebrated on that day. St. Cyprian of Carthage noted that this "anniversary of the invincible" was made actual only in the birth of Jesus-the only *invincible* One.
